Introduction

This directory was created for the purpose of helping high school graduates and post-secondary students find financial support to further their education whether it be at a college/cegep, vocational training centre or university.



Paying for student fees, tuition, books, and residence expenses can be costly, not to mention stressful. For most post–secondary students, the savings accumulated from part–time or summers jobs and contributions from parents will not cover the large expenses for schooling. Additional money given in the form of scholarships and bursaries can be very helpful towards obtaining a degree without the anxiety of accumulating a great deal of student debt.

This directory offers students advice on applying for bursaries and scholarships. It includes practical information such as the benefits of applying, how to apply for awards, and a comprehensive directory of bursaries and scholarships available to students in the Eastern Townships.

The goal of this guide is to support students by facilitating access to financial resources. Bursaries and scholarships are there to help make your journey easier. However, you must be willing to make the effort to apply.

Understanding Scholarships, Bursaries & Loans

It is important to understand the difference between a scholarship, a bursary and a loan to navigate the various types of applications.

Awards (scholarships or bursaries) are given depending on specific eligibility criteria. These requirements are listed by the donor institution or organization. It is important to note that the vast majority of scholarships and bursaries can only be awarded to those who apply.

Scholarship

A financial award given to a student based on their academic standing, either in a specific subject or the average of their overall academic year. Citizenship and leadership skills may also be considered depending on the criteria of the scholarship.

Bursary

A financial award given to a student who has attained a specific level of achievement and demonstrates need for financial assistance.

Achievement may be attributed (but not limited to) to academic standing, to where one lives, to the post-secondary program one is enrolled in, and/or extra-curricular activities one has been involved in.

Loan

A financial advancement given on the understanding that it must be repaid after the completion of a one's studies. In Quebec, many financial institutions offer loan plans for students through a government managed program that is detailed on page 9 of this guide.

Advantages of Applying for Scholarships & Bursaries

Many students do not realize the benefits that are offered when applying for scholarships and bursaries. Although it can be time consuming to apply, there are many advantages to sending in an application proving it is well worth the time.



Earn money

Money awarded to you goes directly towards your educational expenses to help cover tuition, student fees and living expenses. You will have less stress so you can focus on your studies.



Be your own cheerleader

You are giving yourself a chance to be recognized and awarded for your experience and competence. This capacity will go a long way when applying for jobs in the future.



Build your credibility

If you receive an award based on something you have submitted, an achievement, or an academic standing, you can use that on your resume and during a job interview.



Make connections

Many scholarship and bursary donors want to help students advance their career aspirations. Thank them, meet them. This will allow you to connect with leaders in your community.

The next section will focus on preparing for success when applying for awards. To begin, there are three things to keep in mind when considering applying for scholarships and bursaries.

It is important to prepare ahead of time.

Award opportunities can be difficult to find and application deadlines vary. Knowing the opportunities in advance will help you to apply for as many awards as you can. Remember that schools, companies, non-profit groups, and the government all offer scholarships and bursaries. Refer to this directory and ask your school guidance counsellor for assistance in finding awards.

Identify your strengths and acheivements.

Extracurricular activities, school events, academic achievements, and volunteering are all things you can include in an application, and that can make you eligible for an award. Identify awards that fit your profile, noting deadlines and application procedures. If you are unclear about an application criteria, you can always consult with your school guidance counsellor.

Once you have received a letter of acceptance from your post-secondary institution, it is time to start applying for scholarships and bursaries.

In your last year of high school you will be busy working on final projects, brainstorming a possible career path, and selecting a suitable post–secondary program. It is nonetheless important to keep scholarships and bursaries in mind to get an early start.

Application Tips

An application is your key to success. It gives you an opportunity to demonstrate why you deserve the scholarship or bursary.

When writing an application, remember:

- Read the instructions carefully and make sure you understand the award criteria before beginning.
- Ensure your thoughts are organized, clear and focused.
- Use concise and simple language.
- When you are finished, read the instuctions again and proofread your application to ensure that you have addressed all the award criteria.

Here are some tips to create a strong application:

- Create a neat and organized application document with consistent formatting.
- · Include all requested documentation.
- Ensure that any scanned documents are straight and legible.
- Follow delivery instructions as donors may request that applications be mailed, personally delivered, or emailed. If the application is to be sent via email, include a brief introductory text in your email and attach your application as a single PDF document.
- If references are requested, select those who can vouch for your character and work ethic such as a teacher, coach or employer.
- The point of an application is to be straightforward. Do not exceed a requested word count limit.
- Less is more. Cover your ground with few words and avoid unnecessary words such as: like, really or very.
- If a photo is requested, provide an upto-date professional-looking photo.

Unless otherwise indicated, be sure to format your application:

- Double spaced
- Times New Roman font
- 12-point font
- One-inch top, bottom, and side margins

Why Should I Apply?

Take a minute to reflect on all the information you have read so far. You now know the advantages of applying for a scholarship or bursary, and you have some tips to help you succeed when applying.

The government of Quebec offers a vocational, college and university loans and bursaries program. The Loans and Bursaries Program enables you to pursue full-time vocational training, college or university studies when you do not have the financial resources to otherwise do so.

If you are eligible, the program will assess your financial needs. You will initially receive a loan that you will have to repay at the end of your studies. If the loan is insufficient to cover your needs, you could receive a bursary that you will not have to repay.

During your full-time studies:

- You do not repay any amount related to your loan.
- The government pays the interest on your loan for you.
- You may apply for loans and bursaries each year, as long as you are eligible for the program.

After your full-time studies:

- You could get 15% off the amount of your loan if you complete your studies within the prescribed period.
- You will automatically have 6 months before you start repaying your loan. During this period, you can pay the interest or add it to your loan.
- You benefit from an interest rate offered by the government, which is one of the most advantageous on the market.
- You are entitled to a non-refundable tax credit (tax reduction) for the interest you pay on your loan.

Government of Quebec Loans and Bursaries Program

To be eligible for the Loans and Bursaries Program, you must meet the following requirements:

- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or have refugee or protected person status
- be considered a Québec resident
- be enrolled in an educational institution and a program recognized for the awarding of financial assistance
- be a full-time student or be deemed a full-time student
- respect your eligibility period (number of months you can receive financial assistance)
- respect your debt limit (maximum loan amount you can obtain)

Assessment Simulator

You can complete your Application for Loans and Bursaries starting in May for the upcoming school year. Be sure to apply in advance to obtain your financial assistance at the beginning of the school year. Global Excel Scholarship

Awarded to graduating Alexander Galt students continuing their education.

AGRHS / LAMPE Foundation Scholarship

Awarded to a graduating student pursuing post-secondary education. The student must demonstrate high motivation and financial need.

Appalachian Teachers' Association Scholarship

Awarded to any graduating Alexander Galt student. Preference is given students whose parents are teachers.

Betty and Cecil Blenkhorn Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to an individual who has been deeply involved in student activities and had helped make their school environment a better place to be.

Clinton Munkittrick Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to the most enthusiastic graduating hockey player who is pursuing higher education.

James Robert "Bob" McConnachie Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to graduating Alexander Galt students continuing their education.

Nicole Grégoire Scholarship

Awarded to a graduating Alexander Galt student, formerly of North Hatley Elementary School, pursuing higher education.

LAMPE Foundation Leadership Award

Awarded to a student who demonstrates leadership in and outside of school. The student must also have demonstrated high motivation and academic achievement.

AGRHS Special Scholarships, Bursaries & Awards

The following awards cannot be applied for. Candidates are nominated by teachers and selected by special committees.

Bishop's University Scholarship

Awarded to a graduating student, with the highest academic achievement in Level 5, that has been accepted into a post-secondary program of studies.

Champlain Regional College, Lennoxville Campus Scholarship

Scholarships offered to three graduating students, one each from Alexander Galt, Massey Vanier, and Richmond Regional high schools, entering Champlain–Lennoxville in the fall, who have excelled overall academically with an average of over 80%, and obtained the highest combined mark in the subjects of English and French.

Daphne Codère French Scholarships

Awarded for progress in oral French at the Junior and Senior levels at Alexander Galt Regional High School.

ETSB Complementary Service Award

Given annually to a graduate who has shown perseverance in overcoming one or more significant obstacles.

Horizons Scholarship of Achievement Based Upon determination

Awarded to a candidate whose academic achievement is the result of extra effort and determination above that required by regular classroom assignments and instruction. The recipient is selected by teachers on the basis of an intense desire to overcome obstacles, and a marked improvement in academic achievement. The recipient must have been accepted into a post-secondary school program of studies.

Life is Precious Scholarship

Given annually in memory of Chrissy Guillette to a student who accessed PASS at some point while at AGRHS, and who has through determination and perseverance completed his/her program.

Marlis Wehr History Scholarship

Awarded for effort and achievement in history by a graduate of AGRHS.

McGill University's Science & Social Science Awards

Recognizes two graduating students who show exceptional promise in science and mathematics or in social sciences. Award is a McGill University paperweight, to be presented at the annual graduation ceremony, and a tuition credit, redeemable upon registration at McGill in any undergraduate program.

Ralph Steinman Memorial Award

Given annually to a graduate with the greatest potential to benefit humanity. Dr. Ralph Steinman graduated from Sherbrooke High School in 1959. In 2011, he was awarded the Nobel prize in physiology or medicine for his discover of dendritic cells (DCs) and their role in immunity.

The Massey-Vanier Scholarship, Bursary Fund

The Massey-Vanier Scholarship, Bursary Fund (MVSBF) is a registered Canadian charity which offers scholarships and bursaries to Massey-Vanier High School students who wish to pursue post-secondary education at approved colleges (CEGEP), university or in an approved vocational program which leads to a DEP.

In late February, students must file an application form as well as obtain a recommendation from five of their teachers. They must also send a letter of application requesting consideration. The MVSBF Committee then meets to select the best candidates for each award based on the criteria provided by the award donor.

Academic performance is important, but not the sole criteria. Recognition and financial support are also awarded to students who have excelled in specific areas, students planning to follow specific programs, students who have displayed strong personal characteristics, students in financial need, students from specific towns, and students who have performed exceptionally under difficult circumstances.

Candidates who have been chosen to be recipients of MVSBF scholarships and bursaries are invited to attend an Awards Evening, held at Massey-Vanier High School in early June. At this ceremony, donors are invited to attend to present their award to the recipient.




